Step 4: Buy a Domain

What is a Domain Name?

Domain name is the address of your website that people type in the browser URL bar to visit your website. In simple terms, if your website is a office, then your domain name will be its address.

A more detailed explanation: The Internet is a giant network of computers connected to each other through a global network of cables. Each computer on this network can communicate with other computers. To identify them, each computer is assigned an IP (Internet Protocol) address. It is a series of numbers that identify a particular computer on the internet. A typical IP address looks like this:

121.234.101.1

Since an IP address like this is quite difficult to remember therefore domain names were invented to solve this problem.

Now if you want to visit a website, then you don't need to enter a long string of numbers. Instead, you can visit it by typing an easy to remember domain name in your browser's address bar. For example, www.peopletrainers.in

How is Domain Name Different from a Website and Web Hosting?

A website is made up of files like HTML pages, website builder software, images, and more and the domain name is the web address of your website.

How to buy a Domain Name:

Domain names are available in many different extensions. The most popular one is **.com**. There are many other options like **.org**, **.net**, **.tv**, **.info**, **.io**, and more. However we always recommend using **.com** domain extension.

Who is Responsible for Domain Name System?

Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (ICANN) manages the domain names system. It is a non-profit organization that creates and implements the policies for domain names.

ICANN gives permission to companies called Domain Name Registrars for selling domain names.

These domain registrars are allowed to make changes to domain names registry on your behalf.

Domain name registrars can sell domain names, manage its records, renewals, and transfers to other registrars.

As a domain name owner, you are responsible for telling the registrar where to send requests. You are also responsible for renewing your domain registration.

Buy one Domain for yourself from any of the Domain Registrars like

Step 5: Buy a Hosting

If the domain name is the web address of your website, then web hosting is the home where your website lives. This is the actual computer where your website's files are stored. Such computers are called servers and they are offered as a service by hosting companies.

To create your website, you need both domain name and web hosting. However, it's important to remember that they are two separate services, and you can buy them from two different companies. Now you may be wondering, how would it work if you bought them from two separate companies? You just need to edit your domain name settings and enter the Name Server information provided by your hosting company. Name Server information defines where to send user requests for your domain name.

We recommend getting both your domain name and hosting from the same company. This allows you to easily manage them under the same account.

The website registrars mentioned in step 5 sell web hosting and domain name both. You can buy one for yourself as per your need and budget.

Step 6: Connect Domain with your Hosting Server

Now you have to connect your Domain with the Hosting if you have purchased these from different service providers/ registrars.

You are recommended to take both from the same registrar then you need not to connect it. The registrar system itself connect these both.

Step 7: Start Designing Your Content

These days, you don't have to be a professional web designer or developer to make your website look beautiful!

Platforms like WordPress, Wix, and Squarespace come with many pre-designed templates or easy to use drag and drop functionality. They offer themes that you can choose based on your preferred layout and color scheme. And, you can do website design changes, add your own content, and make mobile-friendly websites.

Important things to remember before and after publishing

Before publishing

Legal requirements: Depending on where your business is located, you may be legally required to include certain information on your website. This is usually related to key information about your company or how you handle your customer's data. It's important that you inform yourself about the requirements in your country.

Most importantly, you will need a privacy policy if you are running a commercial website. The BBB offers a template version that you can use:

Install Google Analytics: Google's web statistics tool is one of the best in class, and free too. You can use it to determine the number of visitors to your website, page views, and much more, including where your visitors are located (their country and approximate city).

The most important information it provides however is the number of people who have come to your site via search engines, and the keywords they have used. Once installed, Google Analytics runs in the background and you don't need to worry about it. Register for a free account here:

Final checklist key things

- ✓ If you want to use an email address with your new domain, don't forget to set it up properly before publishing your website.
- ✓ Make sure that your contact form works properly too. The best way to do this is to test it using dummy details.
- ✓ Make sure that you've chosen relevant descriptions for your page titles and descriptions (meta descriptions). They should contain keywords that your customers would use. This information will be used by the search engines.
- ✓ Proofread your website thoroughly for grammar and spelling errors.
- ✓ Check for broken links, for example with a tool like Broken Link Check: brokenlinkcheck.com
- ✓ Test your website on another computer/tablet/smartphone device with a different browser - there may be rendering problems that you can't see on your own system.
